When they're not in the digital dark room, editing and fine-tuning their unique post-production process, Linda Shinkle Rodney and Theodore Shinklethe mother-and-son team behind Shinkle Photography—can often be found snowshoeing, cross-country skiing, hiking, donning waders or boating, all in the name of finding their next subject. "Shapes, abstract and textural elements together with connectivity among shadows, reflections and light inspire our spontaneous and staged tableaux fine art photography," say the duo of their work, which displays an otherworldly view of nature and people.
